

# SCOTLAND SQUADS SELECTION CRITERIA

**DISCIPLINES:** 

Boulder, Lead

**CATEGORIES:** 

Scotland Development Squad:

U19, U17, U15, U13, U11

Scotland National Squad:

U21, U19, U17, Upper U15



#### 1. Purpose of this Document

1.1. To outline the criteria by which selection decisions will be guided for the Scotland Development Squad (SDS) and Scotland National Squad (SNS).

## 2. Selection Points Criteria

- 2.1. Climbers who wish to be considered for selection to either the SDS or the SNS will need to meet the relevant criteria as outlined below.
- 2.2. ClimbScotland shall then review eligible climbers for selection following the panels process and timeframes as explained in the Scotland Squads Selection Strategy.

# 3. Scotland Development Squad - U19, U17, U15, U13, U11

- 3.1. Climbers wishing to be considered for selection to the SDS will need to participate in the relevant competitions during the year between SDS selection panels.
- 3.2. Climbers will be eligible for selection if they meet any of the following criteria:
  - 3.2.1. Qualify for the Youth Climbing Series Grand Final,
  - 3.2.2. Achieve a minimum of **1,750 points**, calculated based on their **best 3 results**, and any **additional points**, using the system detailed below.
- 3.3. If fewer than 4 climbers have been selected through the above criteria, the next highest scoring climber(s), will be selected until 4 are chosen.
- 3.4. Climbers selected for the SDS with the highest points total will be offered a place as an **Aspirant SNS member.** This will be applicable to those that are in U17, U15 and Upper U13 at the point of the SDS selection panels.

## 4. Scotland National Squad - U21, U19, U17, Upper U15

4.1. Climbers wishing to be considered for selection to the SNS will have three pathways through which to be considered for selection.

## 4.2. GB Climbing Squad/Team Selection

4.2.1. Climbers that are current members of the GB Climbing Squad/Team at the point of SNS selection will be eligible for selection to the SNS.

## 4.3. Competition Pathway

4.3.1. Climbers participating in the relevant competitions during the year between SNS selection panels will be eligible for selection if they achieve a minimum of <u>2,500</u> points, calculated based on their <u>best 3 results</u>, and any <u>additional points</u>, using the system detailed below.

# 4.4. Non-Competition Pathway

- 4.4.1. Climbers will need to accumulate points through the completion of up to x10 routes or problems (or a combination of the two), using the points allocation outlined below, across the year between SNS selection panels.
- 4.4.2. Climbers will be eligible for selection if they achieve a minimum of **28 points**
- 4.4.3. At least one route/problem **MUST** be at the top performance standard for that age category (as listed below).
- 4.4.4. They can be a combination of indoor and outdoor performances.
- 4.4.5. Problems on training boards cannot be used.
- 4.4.6. This pathway does not currently extend to the Upper U15 category.



### 5. Selection by Transition

- 5.1. Any GB Climbing Squad/Team member from the year prior that has not gained reselection to this squad/team will be eligible for selection to the SNS for the year ahead.
- 5.2. Any SNS member from the year prior that has not gained reselection to this squad will be eligible for selection to the SDS for the year ahead and will be offered a place as an aspirant SNS member.

## 6. Competition Points Allocation System

- 6.1. To reflect the varying levels of competition, a tiered system will be used to split the points allocation for relevant competitions.
- 6.2. This system will be reviewed and updated as appropriate if competitions are added or changed through the year. Any changes will be published via the <u>Selection Process</u> webpage.
- 6.3. Due to unpredictability of field sizes attempts have been made to taper available points based on potential field sizes. Thus, the minimum field size column is the number of competitors that need to participate to make those points available.
  - 6.3.1. For example to score the points available for 4<sup>th</sup> position, there must have been at least 7 competitors participating in the competition.

- 6.4.3. Scottish ranking points will be considered in relation to the number of Scottish Competitors not the total number of competitors.
- 6.4.4. Any SNS member competing in the YCS will be included in the total number of competitors, but their finishing position will be excluded when assigning points to others.

## 7.1. Additional Notes

- 7.1.1. **Indoor Environment** If all points are accumulated through an indoor environment, these must be accumulated at, at least x2, ClimbScotland International or National Performance Centres:
  - EICA Ratho



- Eden Rock Edinburgh
- TCA Newsroom Glasgow
- The Ledge Inverness
- 7.1.2. **Outdoor Environment** Points accumulated through an outdoor environment:
  - Must be completed at established crags and on established routes.
  - Must have confirmation of the grade from a recognised guidebook, and UKClimbing.com (and their community voting system if applicable).
- 7.1.3. An application form must be completed.
- 7.1.4. In which you will also be asked to include a description of the style and general hold type of the routes/problems, and the number of attempts made.
- 7.2. Verification It is the responsibility of the applicant to provide clear and specific information and verification of each of the ascents listed. Anything listed that does not have all the information required, or is not clearly verified, will not be considered.
  - Only video evidence will be considered to verify ascents listed. All videos must illustrate the complete climb of the route/boulder.
  - This evidence may be provided through social media channels but clear details
    must be given as to where to find the video(s), and if in amongst multiple climbs,
    at what time in the video the relevant climb will appear.
  - In the case of indoor climbs secondary verification must be given for the grade of the route/boulder. This must be given by relevant centres head route setter.
  - On the application form, and alongside the relevant ascents, the applicant must provide the name and contact details of the head setter.
  - If seeking verification from a setter, it is still the full responsibility of the applicant to complete, check and provide the required information – not that of the setter or ClimbScotland. A setter cannot submit an application form on your behalf.
